SETTING UP A MYSQL DATABASE...

Easy WP config software is a tool created to help new and veteran users easily configure wordpress based websites and blogs quickly.

Welcome to Easy WP Config Install guide, this guide is made up of step by step easy to follow instructions designed to help the new user in configuring and installing word press websites.

The first thing you will need is a domain name and web hosting. If you do not yet have a domain name or a hosting account then you will need to put some thought into getting a domain name first.

Seriously, you should choose a domain name with keywords that will work for you in getting traffic to your website.

We will cover the basics however, we will assume at least some knowledge, such as owning a domain name, a hosting account.

We will be covering the basics of setting up a database using Cpanel as provided by hostgator which is a decent host for creating a web presence but you can use just about any service that provides a user interface.

So lets get started... Login to your web hosting control panel and continue following these instructions.

Once you are logged into the Cpanel, look about half way down the control panel and you will see, an icon which is the first step in setting up your MySQL database.

Once you have learned to setup a database you will find that you can easily do again and again.



Page down until you see the header below which will say Databases.

The first icon MySQL Databases,click that and follow the simple instructions to get started.

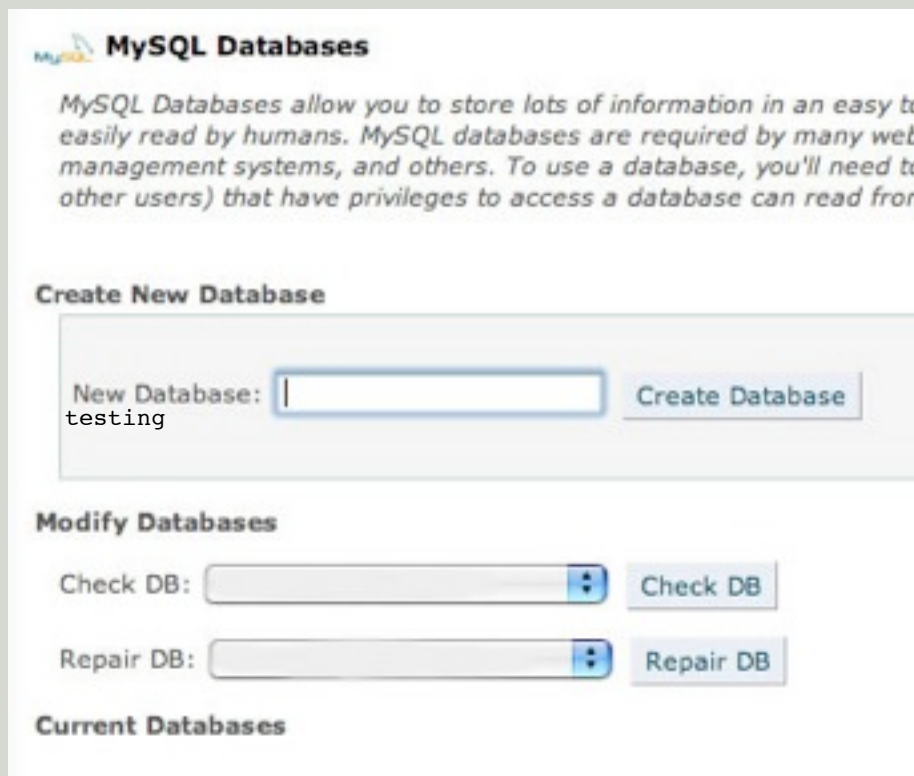


Before you head off to create that database we recommend that you open a text editor or a word pad editor and save it as DB Details this can be txt or rtf, either one is fine. One thing that is very handy is to have all your database information in a text file in case later on you need to reference that information you will have that information easily at hand.

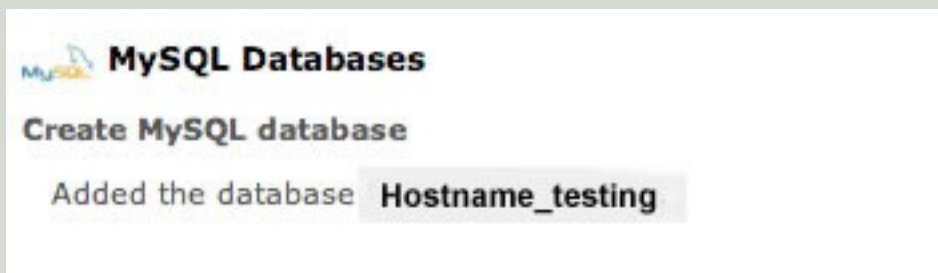
Enter in the name of your new database, then click create database.

You will see a screen like the one shown below, copy that information to your text file, so just copy paste that information into the text file.

This information may be different on some other hosting account control panels.



Once you click create database you will see a different database name, this may be different on some other hosting control panels, copy this exact information into your text file so that you do not have any issues connecting to your database file later on.



After setting up your new database, you need to create a new user and password.

Remember to copy this information to your text file for reference later on.

You can enter in the user name and then the password, you can also use the generate password, feature available on some Cpanel hosts.

After you have the user name and password entered click create user.

You will see an option screen to confirm this user has all privileges.

Make sure that the user you create has all privileges.

Depending on the type of hosting you are using you will need one more piece of information the host type for your database, most of the time the host will be localhost.

Some times this may be different, If in doubt check with your hosting provider for the exact host information, for instance godaddy hosting has a different name which you can get by looking at your hosting control panel.
